Portersfield site is the land at the back of the bus station and where Cavendish house used to be.



Dudley Borough is a great place to live, work and discover. We want to make sure that the Portersfield site compliments the rest of the town and the borough.

A new two way cycle path along Trindle Road that will link to the Black Country museum and to Brierley Hill.



The layout at St Joseph Street will give you safe access for buses and the pavement by Church of Our Blessed Lady will be made wider.



Trindle Road will have a 20mph speed limit.



Pedestrian crossings in three key areas.

- Claughton Rd North and St Joseph Street.
- Porters Street and Birdcage Walk.
- Hall Street and Trindle Road.



Portersfield North will provide a key role in making people feel welcome when they come into Dudley.



Portersfield South where the Hobbs chip shop is to be made a gateway with better public spaces and more trees.



For Hall Street, Trindle Road and Porter Street to be developed in the traditional streets and public spaces.



For the new developments to look good from the bypass. This will include planting of trees and wildflowers.



For Porter Street to be reconnected to Porter Street South by a new footbridge.



The pedestrian's area on the Claughton Road North, improved making the area people feel more welcome.



A new area where buildings are zero carbon ready.
